

### Scottish-Stuart Freemasonry (Roots of the Masonic Bible)

#### September 2019

Whenever there is a discussion on the origins of freemasonry, the issue always arises of what came first, Scottish-Stuart freemasonry or English Grand Lodge freemasonry as declared in 1717. Because of the historical acceptance of the declarations set forth in the CONSTITUTIONS of 1723/34, the English version has never been seriously challenged. However, recent research by non-masonic university professors has challenged that from an independent point of view. In 1601, James VI of Scotland, the son of Mary Stuart (Tudor), became a freemason at the Lodge of Perth and Scoon at the age of 35. He became the supreme patron of freemasonry. The Stuart coat of arms depicted, among other things, a trowel and a sword, which symbolize freemasonry and the Order of the Knights Templar. He was the first head of state to be a freemason.

15 years after taking control of Scotland and 5 years before become James I of England, he ordered that the masonic structure be given leadership and organization. He made senior mason William Schaw, his General Warden of the Craft, and instructed him to revamp the entire Masonic Lodge structure into what it has become today. He organized the craft on a national basis with independent local lodges (councils). This organizational process became the Schaw Statues, from this 1599 directive; lodges were required to employ a reputable notary as secretary, and that he should record all important transactions. The Scottish lodges began to keep minutes, and therefore the appearance of "accepted" or non-operative masons is better recorded than in England, where there are no known internal records of lodge proceedings. The first recorded admission of non-masons was on 3 July 1634 at Lodge of Edinburgh (Mary's Chapel) No. 1.

The reasons and mechanisms for the transition of masonic lodges from operative communities to speculative fellowships remain elusive. As the responsibility for design shifted from the Master Mason to the architect in the sixteenth century, it is probable that architects started to join the lodges of the masons they worked with. It is also possible that, along with other professional bodies (including the East India Company, operative masonic lodges began to raise money by charging the gentry for admission. Another opinion states that masonic lodges deliberately recruited the rich and powerful to improve their pay and working conditions. King James ensured the spread of Freemasonry in England and Scotland, but his death caused a hiatus until the return of Charles II leave a 35-year gap before masonry took off again in England; however, it stayed alive and well in Scotland during that time.

Charles II was in exile in Holland and France during those years and spread Freemason ideas across Europe. Charles II returned to England and re-established Freemasonry and solidified it into what we recognized today. To this day the 1611 King James Bible sits on our alters and serves as our Masonic Bible.
