
families is most important. As we look and pray to a future that enables the immunization of our most vulnerable, the frontline heroes, and the rest of us, there is a light at the end of the tunnel.

Working Tools—The Square

November 2020

(EAs LEAVE ROOM)

The second installment of our Working Tool education – Fellow Craft edition is focused on the level.

The square is perhaps the most integral tool presented to Masons on their journey through the craft. Its physical and literal applications are so crucial to the performance of a physical or operative mason's work that it is only fitting that the symbolic and metaphorical applications are foundational to the Free and Accepted Mason's life and practice.



On the physical plane of crude matter, the square is the tool by which the mason ensures all pieces fit together according to design and contribute to the greater structure. In the metaphor and symbology of Free and Accepted Masons, the Square is the tool by which Masons should judge their own actions and inner nature.

As the mason judges which ashlars have been properly honed and shaped according to the design, the Mason must also judge which of the

pieces of their own lives have been honed and shaped according to the Great Architect's design, diligently and faithfully to examine which pieces need additional work or need to be thrown away and replaced with something more excellent. The fanatical commitment to the pursuit of right action and right belief is a journey which is emphasized every meeting, with the ending "part upon the Square," which is a not-so-hidden call to action for each Mason to spend their lives refining, honing, and even discarding misshapen "pieces" to better fit the most Supreme Master's plan. In 1752, George Washington received his Entered Apprentice degree in Fredericksburg Lodge in Virginia.

In 1813, the Articles of Union of the United Grand Lodge of England were signed

In 1911, Franklin D. Roosevelt (U.S. President 1933-1945) received his 3rd degree.

In 1922, he cornerstone of the George Washington Masonic National Memorial, in Alexandria, Virginia, was laid in a Masonic ceremony.

COVID-19 Information

FROM THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION RE: COVID-19: KNOW HOW IT SPREADS

- There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.
- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
- Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).

• Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

• These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF

Clean your hands often

• Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

• If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.

• Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

AVOID CLOSE CONTACT

Avoid close contact with people who are sick

• Put distance between yourself and other people if COVID-19 is spreading in your community. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT OTHERS

• Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care. Learn what to do if you are sick.

Cover coughs and sneezes

o Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow.

o Throw used tissues in the trash.

o Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

Wear a facemask if you are sick

o If you are sick: You should wear a facemask when you are around other people (e.g., sharing a room or vehicle) and before you enter a healthcare provider's office. If you are not able to wear a facemask (for example, because it causes trouble breathing), then you should do your best to cover your coughs and sneezes, and people who are caring for you should wear a facemask if they enter your room. Learn what to do if you are sick.

o If you are NOT sick: You do not need to wear a facemask unless you are caring for someone who is sick (and they are not able to wear a facemask). Facemasks may be in short supply and they should be saved for caregivers.

Clean and disinfect

o Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.

o If surfaces are dirty, clean them: Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.
