From the East

My Brothers,

I am happy and proud to report that our brothers at Pahrump Lodge #54 met with the officers and I at their last stated meeting and an agreement was reached which would allow Sandy Valley Lodge to meet at their facility. After collaborating with Grand Lodge, I have received permission from Most Worshipful Louis Castle to meet at Pahrump Lodge #54 beginning in October. This permission is temporary due to the COVID-19 emergency and discussion for additional meetings past the first of the year will be brought forward at our next meeting.

Sandy Valley Lodge #57 will hold our stated meeting this upcoming Saturday, October 3rd at 0900. The location will be 281 E. Gemini Dr, Pahrump, NV 89060. If anyone would like to carpool, I would suggest meeting in the parking lot of Bass Pro Shops at 0730. At the next stated meeting, we will be discussing the future meeting location of Sandy Valley Lodge. I would like to provide the background on the topic of moving, what steps and agreements have been made so far, and our options in the future. I would also like to ask any brother with an alternative idea to please attend the meeting and propose your idea. I would like everyone that has ideas, concerns or any input into this topic to please attend the meeting. This forum is very important to the future of our lodge and I encourage you to attend and have a voice in this.

I would also like to dispel any rumors of Sandy Valley attempting to "merge" with another lodge. There <u>have been no discussions</u> on the topic, and between the officers and I, we have never proposed this as a solution. 



September in Masonic History

- In 1793, the cornerstone of the United States Capitol building in Washington D.C. was laid in an elaborate, formal Masonic ceremony, with George Washington personally playing a key role and wearing Masonic regalia.
- ❖ In 1826, William Morgan, who had published an exposé of Masonic secrets, was taken from the jail in Canandaigua, New York, kidnapped, and possibly later murdered. This was the trigger for the Morgan Affair and the Anti-masonic movement and Anti-masonic Party in the United States from the 1820s through the 1840s.
- ❖ In 1872, the Shrine of North America was organized, in New York City.
- ❖ In 1949, Gerald R. Ford (U.S. President 1974-1977) received his 1st degree in Malta Lodge #465, Grand Rapids, Michigan.

COVID-19 Information

FROM THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION RE: COVID-19: KNOW HOW IT SPREADS

- There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.
- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
- Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
- Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.
- These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF

- Illustration: washing hands with soap and water
- Clean your hands often
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

AVOID CLOSE CONTACT

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Put distance between yourself and other people if COVID-19 is spreading in your community. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT OTHERS

- Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care. Learn what to do if you are sick.
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- o Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow.
- o Throw used tissues in the trash.
- o Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Wear a facemask if you are sick
- o If you are sick: You should wear a facemask when you are around other people (e.g., sharing a room or vehicle) and before you enter a healthcare provider's office. If you are not able to wear a facemask (for example, because it causes trouble breathing), then you should do your best to cover your coughs and sneezes, and people who are caring for you should wear a facemask if they enter your room. Learn what to do if you are sick.

- o If you are NOT sick: You do not need to wear a facemask unless you are caring for someone who is sick (and they are not able to wear a facemask). Facemasks may be in short supply and they should be saved for caregivers.
- Clean and disinfect
- o Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.
- o If surfaces are dirty, clean them: Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.
