



GET INVOLVED—YOUTH ARE THE FUTURE OF THE CRAFT

In 1919, Frank Land, as Master Mason, visited with Louis Lower, the son of a Lodge member who had passed. Following their initial meeting, Frank Land invited Louis and eight of his friends to meet at the Masonic Temple in Kansas City, MO where they founded the Order of DeMolay.

Today DeMolay International is an international fraternal organization for young men ages 12 to 21. It was founded in Kansas City, Missouri, in 1919 and named for Jacques de Moley, the last Grand Master of the Knights Templar. DeMolay is open for membership to young men between the ages of 9 and 21 who acknowledge a higher spiritual power. It has about 15,000 active members worldwide. Although young women are not permitted to join DeMolay, chapters are permitted to elect chapter "sweethearts" and "princesses."

DeMolay has seven Cardinal Virtues, taught as its basic ideals. They are:

Filial love (the love between a child and their parent): which is the love and the kindness we should have with our parents, the ones that gave us birth and taught us the first lessons in our lives. Through them we had the first lessons of kindness, respect, and the belief in God.

Reverence for sacred things: it means to believe in God (independent on the religion) and to respect other's beliefs.

Courtesy: kindness, respect and solidarity are principles that a DeMolay tries to practice in his life. Philanthropy is only valid when it is done by heart and soul.

Comradeship: is to be a faithful friend, not only in good times, but also in hard times.

Fidelity: is to believe and follow your own values and virtues; yet keeping in secret everything which is entrusted. Fidelity is to be faithful to God, your homeland, and your friends, following the Jacques DeMolay fidelity lead, who preferred to die instead of betraying his companions or break with his pledge.

Cleanness: means to be an ideal citizen, pure in soul and heart; it is to always have a clear conscience. It means to keep your mind away from everything that is against the values of a good citizen.

Patriotism: is to respect and defend our homeland, our democracy, our state and our city overall. It calls for maintenance for the respect of public heritage, such as schools, asylum, orphanage, and hospitals that support people in need.

In 1922, Reverend Mark Sexson, a Master Mason in McAlester, OK, having worked with the Order of DeMolay saw a similar need for young women and founded the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls ages 12-20.

Today, the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls (IORG) is a Masonic youth service organization which teaches leadership training through community service. Young women (ages 10-20) learn about the value of charity and service through their work and involvement with their annual local and Grand (state or country) service projects.

Love: The International Order of the Rainbow for girls is an organization that is built on Love. It teaches us that we should love those around us – our father, mother, siblings, and friends. Love is the link that binds all of us together, no matter how far apart we may be.

Religion: Though we teach the lesson of religion, we do not require that members of our order believe in any one Religion over another. We ask that they believe in a higher power. Our members have found that a belief in a Higher Power enhances the lessons that they are taught in Rainbow and service to others helps them to feel closer to their creator and grow in their faith.

Nature: We can often miss out on the beauty of nature in a world that moves so fast. This lesson is about taking the time to experience the beauty and joy that comes from being in the out of doors. It gives us time to clear our heads and reconnect to the people and activities that matter most.

Immortality: Immortality is not about death; it is about the afterlife and the footprints left behind. The impression you make and the lives you change will live on after you pass. Death is a part of life, but it is not the end, it is merely the end of one journey and the beginning of another. The people we love continue to live on in the memories of those that remain behind.

Fidelity: Loyalty to your family, friends, school, and the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls is one of the most important characteristics that a young woman can possess. To have truth, honor, and honesty in your life and to make it important will make you a valuable part of this organization.

Patriotism: Love of country and flag is taught at this station. Today, both men and women serve this country and protect our flag; we owe them more than we can ever give for protecting our country and our way of life.

Service: Though all the lessons of Rainbow are important, Service is the cornerstone of our order. Service to family, school, community, and each other is the most important act we can ever do in this life. The opportunity to better our community and world is a chance to make our own life better.

Faith: What we believe can define our life, whether it is a belief in a higher power or in our family and friends. Our faith is what pushes forward, it gives our life direction and helps us to strive and fulfill our dreams.

Hope: Hope is an invisible feature in all of our lives, no matter where we travel, hope is never far behind. It helps us believe in the kindness and virtue of others and it gives us the strength to get through the day. It is a combination of faith and love. It asks us to trust in ourselves and in others and to believe in the goodness of the world.

Charity: Charity and service go hand in hand in this organization. Charity is doing a kind act for someone else, never asking for recognition for the deed. In our ceremonies it says, "Charity is the embodiment of everything good, it includes not only alms for the poor and kindness for the distress." It is through loving service, kindness and charity that we discover the real secrets to life.

Founded in 1920, by Ethel T. Wead Mick in Omaha, Nebraska, The Order of Job's Daughters. Today, the purpose of Job's Daughters International is to band together young girls to strive to build character through moral and spiritual development. Goals include a greater reverence for God and the Holy Scriptures, loyalty to one's country, and that country's flag, and respect for parents, guardians, and elderly. Members can be found in the United States, Canada, Australia, the Philippines, and Brazil. Girls aged 10-20 can join Job's Daughters International Youth Group.

Job's Daughters perform service projects to help their community and the less fortunate. We actively support the Hearing Improvement Kids Endowment (HIKE) Fund, which purchases hearing assistive devices for hearing impaired children.

They also gain valuable leadership experience, serve as part of a team, and learn democratic principles as they run their own meetings, decide their own activities, and plan their own events.

Job's Daughters is an organization for young women that provides a safe place for girls to have fun, learn leadership skills, and be an active part of their community! Young women have an opportunity to bloom, lead, and soar, and Job's Daughters gives them the tools to do exactly that.

BLOOM: Through local gatherings, we provide a safe and fun place for girls to become confident women. Activities might include a movie night, scavenger hunt, local gatherings, and more fun things!

LEAD: Through business meetings, leadership camps, and organizing events and fundraisers, young women develop the leadership skills needed to be amazing leaders.


SOAR: Through Job's Daughters young women are set-up to soar in whatever they put their minds to! And scholarships to help them get there, life-long friends and supporters.

These youth organization promote the values of our Masonic Fraternity to our next generation. The world will benefit from the lessons that we can impart to our children, and our Masonic youth organizations are a way to directly accomplish that. This does not diminish what we do as Masons, but rather strengthens us.



While there is somewhat of a renaissance happening in Rainbow right now, DeMolay is struggling with Advisor support and members. Rainbow Assemblies across the state are growing, but the girls still need your support.

If asked, brother who has served as advisors within our masonic youth organization, will say with all sincerity that there is no better feeling than watching a young man or young woman grow into adulthood with the love, care, strength, and intelligence to make a difference in the world, and knowing that we had at least a small part in their development. Active involvement in our youth organizations provides benefits beyond comprehension, including developing a better understanding of Masonic Family, how crucial this is to the success of our organizations, and how wonderful it feels to be a part of it. It will make you a better Mason and a better man and ultimately, isn't that the goal of our Masonic teachings?
