Masonic Youth Groups

There are three Masonic Youth Organizations within our Fraternity.

- Order of Demolay
- Job's Daughters International
- The International Order of the Rainbow

Order of DeMolay:

The Order of DeMolay was founded by Brother Frank S. Land in 1919. After the initial formation of the youth club, Brother Land and other early members named the group after Jacques DeMolay and met regularly at the Kansas City Masonic Temple. The Order was open to young men aged 16 to 21 originally (Now it is 12-21). The success and popularity of the original DeMolay group spurred members to set up chapters across the country. When Brother Land died in 1959, there were 135,000 DeMolay members and 2,097 chapters in 14 countries. Local chapters were and still are sponsored by a Masonic organization.

DeMolay participates in various acts of community services and strives to create young men that will grow up to be great sons, which in turn will create great fathers to our youth.

The Emblem: The crown appearing in the self-adopted heraldic arms (the emblem) of the order contains 10 rubies, each representing one of the original nine members and the organization's founder, Frank S. Land.

The rubies were originally portrayed as pearls; as each founding member died, the pearl representing him was changed to a ruby.

The Seven Cardinal Virtues: We as Masons must also value these virtues.

- Filial love (the love between a child and their parent)
- Courtesy: kindness, respect and solidarity Comradeship:
- Fidelity: is to believe and follow your own values and virtues;
- Cleanness: means to be an ideal citizen, pure in soul and heart;
- Patriotism: is to respect and defend our homeland, our democracy, our state.

International Order of the Rainbow for Girls: The International Order of the Rainbow for Girls prepares girls for responsible and purposeful adulthood through character and leadership development, encouraging unselfish service and higher ideals in life, and promoting teamwork and effective interpersonal communications.

In 1922, Rainbow was created for young women whose fathers were members of the Masonic Lodge, and their friends. Although a Christian minister named W. Mark Sexson founded the organization, today the leaders of Rainbow Girls respect and welcome all girls from every religion. Their main focus is more on the spiritual principles of being a kind and caring person. While the Rainbow practices and programs continue to evolve, the basic teachings of faith, hope, and charity remain a cornerstone of this dynamic girl's youth group. Since November of 1951, world headquarters for the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls has been located in McAlester, Oklahoma.

Today, there are more than 850 assemblies across the world that have bimonthly meetings. This is how the members learn standard meeting protocol and parliamentary procedure.

Values: The colors on the Rainbow of their Emblem reflect on what is learned as members of the organization:

- Red-Love
- Orange- Religion
- Yellow- Nature
- Green- Immortality
- Blue- Fidelity
- Indigo- Patriotism
- Violet- Service

The foundation behind every lesson supports 3 basic teachings:

- 1. Faith in a supreme being and in others.
- 2. Having hope in all that you do.
- 3. Charity toward others.

<u>Job's Daughters International</u>: Job's Daughters International strives to create strong young women, respecting tradition and shaping future leaders.

The organization was founded by Ethel T. Wead Mick in 1920 out of her home in Omaha, Nebraska. Job's Daughters International is a Masonic affiliated youth organization for girls and young women aged 10 to 20. The organization is commonly referred to as simply Job's Daughters or Jobies, and sometimes abbreviated as JDI. Goals include a greater reverence for God and the Holy Scriptures, as stated in the Job's Daughters Constitution, loyalty to one's country and that country's flag; and respect for parents, guardians, and elderly. The organization prides itself on charity and services. They contribute largely to HIKE (The Hearing Improvement Kids Endowment.) since 1985.

(b) Complete the form reports concerning audits and return the same to the Grand Secretary as required by Section 4.310.

(c) Perform such other duties as are required by the Constitution, regulations of the Grand Lodge, and the bylaws of the Lodge.

To this end, rest assured that your Trustees will carry out these duties to the best of our abilities and always with the benefit of the craft and lodge as its guide.
