As you may recall, Sandy Valley Lodge voted to amend our bylaws to allow for dues increase to offset the costs of having to move to Pahrump and inflation.

The new dues for 2023 are now \$65.00 plus the fees for the Grand Lodge per capita/George Washington Memorial. This brings the dues owed for **2023 to \$101.00**.

As a reminder, only Master Masons are required to pay dues.

Life Memberships will be available at the old rate of \$1,491.00 until December 31st, 2022. On January 1st, the Life Membership rate will increase to \$2,121.00.

To help us ensure a successful year in 2023, I kindly ask that you pay your 2023 dues as soon as possible so that we have an accurate accounting for our operating budget next year. The Lodge Leadership team has some great events and programs planned for the upcoming year and we look forward to having you be a part of it.

Annual Masonic Education

Monthly Education Lecture—January 2023

What is Harmony?

The dictionary defines musical harmony as "the combination of simultaneously sounded musical notes to produce chords and chord progressions having a pleasing effect"

Musical harmony doesn't mean that every musician is sounding the same note at the same time. Instead, harmony means that different musicians play different notes yet still produce a pleasing end result when all the notes are played together. To do this, each musician must understand what the other musicians are doing if the group is to play in harmony.

In Masonry, harmony isn't the state of full agreement by all parties on every detail.

We hear the Senior Warden at every lodge meeting say "Harmony being the support of all institutions, especially this or ours" and the Worshipful Master saying "I now declare the Lodge open at the time strictly forbidding any un masonic conduct whereby harmony of the same might be disturbed"

As Masons, we are taught to strive for harmony in the lodge. We are to work together to produce a pleasing end result.

However, harmony doesn't mean we are to stay silent about important issues for fear of offending someone, nor does maintaining harmony require us to stay silent when someone says or does something we believe is detrimental to the lodge, to another Mason, or to the speaker himself. In fact, as Masons we are required to speak up in those situations.

So what is harmony? Harmony is the ability to speak, to listen, and to disagree without being disagreeable.

When we speak, we should attempt to temper our words as much as possible, especially if the subject at hand is one on which the speaker and listener might disagree. We should be clear in our speech, yet avoid inflammatory language. When offense is given inadvertently, we should be quick to recognize that and make such amends as we can.

As listeners, we should pay attention to the content of the speech, and do our best to ignore harsh words that may be unintended, or said in the heat of the moment. It's always better to ask for clarification than to assume ill intent.

The best motives can often be hidden by a poor choice of words, or often by using words that have different meanings for the speaker and the listener. Just as it is incumbent upon a speaker to recognize that offense has been given, it is just as important for the listener to realize that not all offense is intentional, and to try and forgive those who trespass against us.

Today, before we take offense, let us at least pause long enough to ask ourselves "Just what did the other person mean by that?". If need be, ask for clarification.

In other words, let us stop, think, and measure the situation and the intent before we stop, think, and measure our response. That way, like the musicians, maybe we can speak and act in harmony in our lodges and in our lives.

2. The Board of Trustees shall:

(a) Have charge of all real and personal property belonging to the Lodge and shall transact all business relative thereto as provided in the Nevada Revised Statutes.

(b) Complete the form reports concerning audits and return the same to the Grand Secretary as required by Section 4.310.

(c) Perform such other duties as are required by the Constitution, regulations of the Grand Lodge, and the bylaws of the Lodge.

To this end, rest assured that your Trustees will carry out these duties to the best of our abilities and always with the benefit of the craft and lodge as its guide.
